On behalf of the Commission on the Status of Women (CSW) I would like to alert the campus community about our call for mini grant proposals.

The CSW is offering grants for projects which will promote the goals of the CSW at the University of Arizona. Average grants range from \$500 to \$1,500 and will be awarded based on impact of the proposed activity or project. The Commission on the Status of Women strengthens the University of Arizona by advocating an inclusive and just campus community. In keeping with this mission, CSW affirms the following goals:

- To identify and provide leadership on issues that affect women
- To develop and support university policies and practices that promote equity and diversity
- To increase leadership and advancement opportunities for women and other under-represented groups
- To collaborate with other groups to create inclusive and safe communities
- To foster individual and collective accountability that promotes justice, equity and diversity
- To educate the campus community about the goals and work of the Commission

Eligibility

All members of the University of Arizona: students, faculty, and staff, departments and organizations are eligible to apply for the grant funds.

Priority Consideration

Each year, the CSW highlights one of its workgroups as an annual priority area. For the 2005-2006 academic year the CSW is highlighting the Hate Crimes and Bias Motivated Incidents (HCBMI) workgroup as its strategic priority. Therefore we especially invite proposals for projects designed to address bias on campus. Projects that promote educational awareness of bias on campus or that are otherwise aligned with the efforts of HCBMI workgroup will be given priority. [Bias is a preformed negative opinion or attitude toward an individual or a group of persons based on their sex, race, religion, ethnicity or national origin, disability or perceived disability, sexual orientation or gender identity, or physical characteristics.]

Important Dates and Award Limits

Applications will be accepted from February 6, through February 28, 2006 and the maximum award is \$1,500. Notification about award status will be provided in March 2006.
